#### **Harper Anderson - NAIDOC Award 2024**



My name is Harper Anderson and I am 13 years old. I have lived in Whyalla all my life but my Aboriginal family are from Ceduna on the West Coast of South Australia. My grandmother and extended family live there. I am part of the Kokatha people of that area.

Sport is a big part of my life and I have played sports since I was 4 years old when I started playing basketball. From there I was also part of the Whyalla Stinger swimming club and I played netball. When I was about 7 I really wanted to play soccer and so I joined up and played for Wanderers Soccer Club.

There were times that I was playing 4 sports in a season and I would play one sport and after the game I would get changed and go to another sports straight after.

I have also been lucky enough to represent Whyalla several times in all of my chosen sports.

When I was in the swim club we would go to swimming carnivals at Port Augusta, Clare, Boolaroo, Port Pirie and other towns as well as at the Marion aquatics centre in Adelaide.

I have represented Whyalla for netball, and have been a part of the Whyalla Steelers squad on several occasions for Basketball where we won the 2024 Whyalla carnival and I was awarded the MVP for the entire carnival. Last steelers season I also won MVP for the team which I was really honoured to win. Winning those medals was a huge honour and our team did really well to win the comp.

I have represented Whyalla in the state Aboriginal netball competition twice and I will be representing Whyalla again in October this year. This is a great competition because there are thunderbirds talent scouts there and already some Whyalla girls have been chosen to train in the rising sister's squad.

I have represented Whyalla in the girls' soccer team for the last 3 years where we have played at the country and state championship tournaments.

This winter has been very busy for me as I have played two grades of Basketball as well as netball and soccer. I

had either training or a game every day and some days there was a game and trainings on.

Because of all of the above someone nominated me for a NAIDOC award and I was lucky enough to win. I won the Aboriginal junior female sports person of the year award.

This made me feel very proud because I have been involved in a lot of sports and it was nice to be seen and commended by my people for all the work I have done. What made it extra special was that my cousin Kyle won the male sports person of the year award at the same time and we were able to get our awards together.
