Cyber Safety Families Presentation

Halloween

It was in the ninth century that Pope Gregory IV designated November 1 as All Saints Day. Over time, the practice developed of remembering others who had died. In the eleventh century, November 2 was designated as a day to pray for all the others. This day is celebrated today as All Souls Day. It is also how we have ended up with Halloween on October 31. All Saints Day was also known as All Hallows Day (Hallow being an older word for Holy person or Saint). The night before being the eve - hence Hallows Eve. At Samaritan, our special dress up day is in Book Week i.e. we do not have school dress up for Halloween. But we do know some students will dress up after school and go trick or treating in their neighbourhood. We do discuss this practice with our younger students and reinforce the age old practice of 'stranger danger'.

School Counselling Program at Samaritan College

At Samaritan College, Centacare Catholic Country SA offer therapeutic counselling onsite across all campuses. School Counsellors are qualified counsellors and social workers and are trained in therapeutic interventions. Students may seek counselling for a wide range of issues such as anxiety, stress, lack of motivation, sadness, anger, conflict with others (including friends, teachers and family), grief and loss, study load, bullying, self-esteem, relationship issues, family separation or concern for a friend. School counselling is a confidential service, and counsellors are not permitted to repeat content of sessions to anyone without permission, unless there is risk to a person's safety.

Students, staff and caregivers can all refer to the service. At each campus we have a referral box with Student Counselling Referral and Intake forms placed next to these. These can be filled out and placed in the boxes which are checked regularly. This form is also on the college website, it can be filled out electronically and emailed to the relevant school counsellors

Examinations

Our Year 12 students commence their examinations, with Mathematical Methods on November 4. We wish everyone who has an exam the best of luck. Undertaking examinations can be a stressful experience, but it is important to learn how to manage the stress. To assist students in learning how to deal with the stress of exams we encourage our Year 11 and 10 students to sit exams. This provides them the opportunity to explore methods to deal with the stress and study techniques to improve their knowledge of content that has been covered in class. Examinations for Year 11 and 10 students occur in a few weeks so now is the time for students to start reviewing work that has been covered this semester.

Year 12 Support

To assist our Year 12s prepare for their exams and/ or finalise assignments, they are welcome to use the Library resources and work with teachers. We ask that after today, Year 12s who return to campus sign in and out at the Front Office (for Work Health Safety reasons) and wear the college uniform.
